**I. The declaration of Paul. 1 Corinthians 15:1-2**

Jesus, God the Son, came to earth as a baby to grow up and take the cross in our place, so that we could have forgiveness of sin, peace with God, and new life through His \_\_\_\_\_.

- "The Gospel is only of benefit if it is \_\_\_\_\_ and if one will stand in it." (David Guzik) **John 1:11-12**

The fact that the Corinthians were trusting in what Jesus did on the cross for the forgiveness of their sin, and to grant them salvation, was proof that their faith was not in \_\_\_\_\_.

**II. The message of the Gospel. 1 Corinthians 15:3-4**

The fact that the Only, Almighty, Creator God of the universe would die for the sins of those He created goes beyond \_\_\_\_\_.

- The Resurrection of Christ is the \_\_\_\_\_ that Jesus was who He said He was. If Jesus had only died, He would be no different than other religious leaders who have died. **2 Corinthians 5:21**

**Romans 4:25 was delivered up because of our offenses, and was raised because of our \_\_\_\_\_.** NKJV

**III. Eye witness testimony. 1 Corinthians 15:5-8**

There were actually no eye witnesses during the Resurrection of Christ, but there were many \_\_\_\_\_ of the Resurrected Jesus.

- Paul considered the Lord's appearance to him on the road to Damascus as the \_\_\_\_\_ post-resurrection appearance of Jesus.

**IV. Practical Application: the evidence is not enough.**

"Not only did they see Jesus after His death, but they saw Him in a manner which revolutionized their \_\_\_\_\_ and trust in Him." (David Guzik)

- Ask Jesus to take over your life, so that He becomes Lord and \_\_\_\_\_. Turn away from your sin and turn toward the Lord.

**Matthew 28:1-6, John 20:19-21**
4. What did Paul mean when he said in **1 Corinthians 15:8**, "Then last of all He was seen by me also, as by one born out of due time." NKJV?
5. Read **Hebrews 11:1-6**. Discuss the practical application from this sermon.  
**John 3:16, Romans 3:10, Romans 3:23, Romans 5:8, Romans 6:23, Romans 10:9-13, James 2:19, 1 John 5:11-13**
