I. Walk this way! Ephesians 5:15	
Walking <i>circumspectly</i> can mean that we are to walk with extreme	
, while inspecting our surroundings, and the term <i>walk</i> is a	
reference to our relationship with the Lord.	
 Jesus did not die on the Cross so we could live out religious 	
or rituals. He died to provide a way to re-establish a	
relationship with fallen mankind. Colossians 2:6-7	
To continue growing in our relationship with Christ and to shine brightly in	
a dark world, we must walk in the power and presence of the Holy Spirit	
and in the light of <i>Psalm 119:105</i>	
II. Seize the opportunity. Ephesians 5:16	
Redeeming the time literally means to buy up something or to take	
advantage of the	
 The man in Luke 12 was a fool, not because of his wealth, but because 	
he lived without any thought of eternity or using his time	
to meet the Lord. <i>Luke 12:16-21</i>	
"The ' evil day ' means a Satanic" (Martyn Lloyd-Jones)	
• In <i>Ephesians 5:16</i> , the exhortation is to for the	
battle.	
III. God's will. Ephesians 5:17	
God's will for every believer is primarily ""; what He plans	
for us to do flows out of who He has made us to be.	
1. Spending time in the Word, time on it.	
2. Have a vital life. (authentic conversations with Him)	
3. Authentic (a lifestyle of thanksgiving and praise)	
4. our minds, will, devotion, attitudes, and rights.	
IV. In Christ, be careful with what controls you. Ephesians 5:18	
There is a two-fold admonition in <i>Ephesians 5:18</i> ; don't be controlled by	
alcohol; instead, be by the Holy Spirit.	
If your Christian cause someone else to stumble,	
you are not seeking other people's well-being.	

The new person in Christ is admonished to be filled (controlled by	oy the
Spirit), and in the original language, this verse teaches us to be	
filled with the Holy Spirit.	
• Being filled with the Holy Spirit is not a suggestion, but	rather it is
a As Christ followers, we are to give con	itrol of
ourselves over to the Holy Spirit.
