I. The cross predicted through King David. *Psalm 22:1-5*

This *Psalm*, written by David is known as the *Psalm of the Cross*; Jesus actually _____ this *Psalm* which was written hundreds of years prior, while He was on the cross.

1. *My God, My God. Psalm 22:1*

The title Jesus uses here is the strongest title for God; “*EI*” which means “The _____ God!” *2 Corinthians 5:21*

2. *I cry in the daytime, but You do not hear. Psalm 22:2-3*

God’s timing is perfect and even though Jesus would have to endure this time of pain, the Father is _____ working out His eternal plan of salvation.

3. *Past times of faithfulness. Psalm 22:4-5*

Faith is _____ the Lord, especially through the darkest hours of life. *Hebrews 11:1*
