I. Traveling to enemy territory. <i>Matthew</i> 15:21-22
The Pharisees were not concerned with people's; but they were

II. No reply at all. <i>Matthew15:23-24</i>
This woman is desperate and has come seeking the only who could
heal her daughter.
 Instead of being compassionate towards needy people, the
Disciples tell Jesus to them away.
As such, for the present, a Gentile woman had no upon Him; and
so He answered her not a word." (H.A. Ironside)
III. In desperation, she worships. <i>Matthew 15:25-26</i>
This time the woman came to Jesus in worship and falls at
His feet and calls Him Lord (<i>kyrios</i> : master, owner).

The woman is saying, "I understand that Israel must be first, however if

- Read Matthew 15:23. Jesus' disciples urge Him to send the Canaanitewoman away. What reason does Jesus give for not initially addressingher plea (v. 24)? Matthew 10:5-6, Matthew 14:15, Mark 6:34
- 3. Why did Jesus say to the woman in **Matthew 15:24**, "**I was not** sent except to the lost sheep of the house of Israel"? John 1:11-13, Acts 1:8, Romans 1:16, John 3:16, Isaiah 42:6, Titus 2:11, 1 Timothy 4:10
- Discuss the biblical meaning and context of the Greek word pharmakeia that was mentioned along with demon possession during the sermon. In the New Testament, there are 3 verses with this word: *Galatians 5:20, Revelation 9:21, Revelation 18:23*.
- Discuss the difference between Jesus calling this woman a little dog and the Jewish sediment referring to Gentiles as Dogs. *Acts 22:19-23*
- 6. The Canaanite woman had faith that a "crumb" from Christ would provide a breakthrough. In her case, the crumb was healing. *Can you recall a time when a simple crumb or glimmer of hope was enough to answer a prayer in your life? Matthew 8:8-10, Mark 7:25*
