II. A beautiful son was born. Exodus 2:1-4
Hebrews 11:23 By faith Moses, when he was born, was hidden three
months by his parents, because they saw he was a beautiful child; and
they were of the king's command. NKJV

complete trust and in the LORD, even though she had
no physical proof that the LORD would answer her prayers.
III. A daughter's compassion. Exodus 2:5-10
Moses and his whole family were blessed because of the of his
godly mother.
<ul> <li>The Jewish historian Flavius Josephus wrote that Moses was</li> </ul>
to the throne of Egypt and that while a young man, he led
the armies of Egypt in a victorious battle against the Ethiopians.

mixed with faith in Him.
