- 1. Read Mark 12:13-15a. Who were the Pharisees? Who were the Herodians? Why did these two groups hate one another? What common interest brought these two groups together and why? Mark 3:6, Mark 3:23-27, Mark 12:14
- 2. Read *Mark 12:15b-17*. "Discuss some ways it is difficult to submit to government authorities, even though the Bible teaches they are ordained by God." (Wiersbe)

- **3.** Read *Exodus 17: 1-7 and Malachi 3:8-10.* Discuss the differences in these passages about testing the Lord.
- 4. Read Mark 12:18–27 and Deuteronomy 25:5. The Sadducees present Jesus with an absurd scenario of seven brothers marrying the same woman. They ask whose wife she would be in the resurrection since they all had her as a wife in this life. Jesus said they were mistaken. Why were they mistaken according to Jesus?
