

**Put On the New Man**  
**Colossians 3:10-13, Matthew 18:23-34**

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**I. Renewed according to Christ's image. Colossians 3:10-11**

The verbs "**put off**" and "**put on**" are a one time and complete action, however, the Greek verb "**renewed**" is a present participle and is better translated as, \_\_\_\_\_ being "**renewed**".

- "In spite of the ravages of sin, man still bears the \_\_\_\_\_ of God." (Wiersbe)

**II. Pieces of your new wardrobe. Colossians 3:12**

The new man is not only **elect** because the Lord called the person; they are also **holy** because the Lord has set them \_\_\_\_\_; and they are **beloved** (literally; a much loved person) by God.

1. **Tender** \_\_\_\_\_.
2. **Kindness**.

When we live \_\_\_\_\_ lives we will be tenderhearted and kind to one another.

**3. Humility.**

"Humility is not thinking poorly of oneself. Rather, it is having the proper estimate of oneself in the \_\_\_\_\_ of God." (Wiersbe)

**4. Meekness.**

A Christian has the same power that rose Jesus from the grave living inside of them; but the awesome power a Christian possesses is \_\_\_\_\_ by the same Spirit as well.

**5. Longsuffering.**

"Longsuffering shows how humility will effect my reaction towards others; I will not become impatient, short, or filled with resentment towards the \_\_\_\_\_ and sins of others." (David Guzik)

**III. A Christ follower must forgive. Colossians 3:13, Matthew 18**

"Learning how to forgive is one of the \_\_\_\_\_ of a happy Christian life." (Wiersbe)

- We are not told to offer forgiveness to someone because they deserve it, we offer forgiveness \_\_\_\_\_; the same way we received it.

Jesus teaches one of the worst \_\_\_\_\_ we can find ourselves in, is one of our own making by choosing to not forgive.

4. Read **Colossians 3:13** and **Matthew 18:23-34** and discuss the trappings of unforgiveness as well as the benefits of forgiveness in Christ.
5. In **Matthew 18:23-34**, what was the response of the first servant to the second servant's plea for mercy in **vs. 30**? What was the master's response to the first servant in **vs. 32-33**? What does the master do with the unforgiving, first servant in **vs. 34**?
6. In **Matthew 18:23-34**, how could the unforgiving first servant ever expect to pay off his debt while he is incarcerated with the torturers (**vs. 34**)? How should we forgive others who have wronged us and owe us a debt?
